Award to Students Beginning Year 12

Gold

Achieve 80 credits or more at Excellence in level 1 NCEA or above in preceding calendar year.

Silver

Achieve 66–79 credits at Excellence in level 1 NCEA or above in preceding calendar year.

Excellence

Those who achieve 50-65 credits at Excellence in level 1 NCEA or above in the preceding calendar year.

Award to Students Beginning Year 13

Gold

Achieve 66 or more credits at Excellence in level 2 NCEA or above in preceding calendar year.

Silver

Those who achieve 50-65 credits at Excellence in level 2 NCEA or above in the preceding calendar year.

Award to Students who completed Year 13 the preceding year

Gold

Achieve 66 or more credits at Excellence in level 3 NCEA or above in preceding calendar year.

Scholarship Award

Those who achieve a Scholarship whilst in Year 12 and/or Year 13 will be recognised with a certificate and a small acknowledgement.
